- Proposed Amendment for Cannabis Operators Zoning Case #2024-02zc- Chapter 120 (NEW definitions) adult use cannabis operator means a level I adult use cultivator, an adult use processor, and an adult use dispensary. Adult use cultivator means a level I adult use cultivator or a level II adult use cultivator. Adult use dispensary means a person licensed pursuant section 3780.15 of the Revised Code, and any rules promulgated thereunder to sell adult use cannabis as authorized. As defined is not permitted. Adult use processor means a person licensed pursuant 3780.14 of the revised code, and any rules promulgated thereunder to manufacture adult use cannabis as authorized. Amendment Legal Ad was advertised in The Vindicator on 8/28/2024. Action of Mahoning County Planning Commission on June 4, 2024 Approved 3 Disapproved 3. Jackson Township Zoning Commission on July 10, 2024 - Vote For-4 Against-1-Approved.

SPECIAL PROJECTS:

- Received the award announcement from the Ohio Dept Commerce for Cemetery Grant FY 2025 of \$2500.00 for the repair and reset of monuments in our active cemetery.
- Mr. Jakubec has received a couple of estimates on fixing/replacing the brick on the Jackson Business Park sign. To grind out and repoint the brick will be approximately \$3,000. Tear down and rebuild the brick \$8,000. Mr. Jakubec and Mr. Hemphill will do a scope for repair/replacement of the brick and then the trustees will decide on how to proceed after bids are received.

RESOLUTION #24-108: Mr. Hemphill moved and Mr. Frost seconded the motion approving the payment to ms Consultants in the amount \$3,250 for modified cemetery paving project scope of service. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous.

Mr. Jakubec wants to use any leftover cemetery grant money for crack and seal of the cemetery.
